




## **ZX500 Features**

#### **CD/MP3/DVD Disc Player**

Compatible with standard size CD, MP3 and DVD discs (4.75" or 12 cm). The ZX500 will read standard DVD+R, DVD-R and DVD RW discs.

#### **Built-In AM/FM Tuner**

27 preset FM stations and 9 AM stations available to select

#### **Built-In Weather Band Tuner**

This unit can receive the latest weather forecast reports broadcast on 7 different frequencies - with strongest station automatically selected.

#### **Built-In TV Tuner**

This unit can receive TV programs being broadcasted by air or from a cable source. An external TV antenna is necessary for air TV reception.

#### 3 Audio and Video Output locations

This unit supplies quality high power audio and video outputs to three different rooms. Room A receives 5.1 full digital surround sound. Room B and C receive standard stereo audio.


#### Two Inputs (1 Audio Video and 1 Audio)

This unit has one AV-IN (INPUT1) and one AUDIO-IN (INPUT2) to allow users to enjoy Audio and Video entertainment from other AV sources such as Satellite Radio, iPod Video, VCR, Digital Camera, Video Game Player, etc. These sources must be connected through the two inputs on the back of the unit or through additional accessory wall plates.

#### **Sound Equalization Control**

Allows control of the Bass, Treble, and Balance. Allows the modification of sound into each of the available 3 rooms.

Press to increase or decrease the sound volume.



#### MUTE

Turn the sound off or on with this single button. Works on all Rooms where the sound is being played.



#### BC

Pressing the BC button defaults to factory settings.



#### TV CHANNEL UP/DOWN

After Auto-Seek, press to go to next higher or lower TV station.



#### SETUP

Press for TV or DVD setup menu.

DVD Only - Selects upper menu.



It is important to understand what is shown on the digital display:

- 1. Preset Number Indicator: Indicates the preset station is selected.
- 2. Band Indicator: Indicates the radio band. AM, FM 1, 2, 3 or Weather Band
- 3. Frequency Indicator: Indicates the radio frequency.

The radio is divided into four bands; FM1, FM2, FM3 and AM. There are 9 positions available for each band to preset favorite stations.



FUNCTION

How to select the Radio Reception Mode

To preset 89.3 MHz (frequency 89.3 MHz and FM3 band is used as an example only) at No.6 of FM3 band, the user needs to switch to the FM3 band first and push left or right tuning button to tune to 89.3 MHz. 

How to recall the preset stations

A station preset at No. 5 position on the FM2 band, and this station is desired, then push the BAND button repeatedly until FM2 appears on the digital readout, and then push the No. 5 button.

Manual Tune Up or Down



Push either key to move the channel selection up or down.

#### Auto search for an available station



Push to auto search or the cluster or buttons on the remote for an available station at a lower or higher frequency near the current station. When this function is selected, the unit will stay at the selected station until another function is selected.

Auto Seek through all the ranges of the FM or AM bands

Quickly push the FAST RWD button. The unit will begin searching until the next available station from lower to higher frequency is found. LOC will not appear when set automatically. Local can be set manually with the LOC/DX button





UNIT **KEYS** 

#### To Load a Disc

There are several ways to select and load a disc into the ZX500.

If you have left a disc in the unit you will have to press FUNCTION on the front panel until DISC shows on the display. If you are using the remote, press the DISC button. Either of these options will start the disc playing.



Note: If you have chosen "Last Memory ON" in the General Setup Menu Page your disc will start where you turned it off at and NOT the beginning of the disc.

Another way to play a disc is to insert it into the slot. The unit will switch to disc by itself.

CAUTION: If the disc won't load into the slot DON'T force it. You will damage the loader, the disc or both (You just might find the disc you thought you lost last week).

**Eject a Disc** 

Regardless of which function is playing, if the EJECT button on the front panel or the remote control is pushed, the unit will stop playing and eject the disc. The unit will keep the disc in the slot with EJECT showing on the Digital Display.

If there is no disc inside the unit, a disc placed in the slot will be taken inside automatically with LOADING showing on the Digital Display.

#### **REMARK:**

When the unit ejects a disc and the disc isn't removed after 1 minute, the unit will automatically reload the disc. This feature protects the disc from being dropped and damaged.

Play / Pause

Normally, when the unit accepts a disc with no Playback Control, The unit will play the disc from the beginning. When a Playback Control exists, the user needs to push the Play button to start to play the disc. If the user pushes this button again, the unit will pause the disc. To release Pause, push this button again, and play will continue.



When the unit is in Disc Play mode, if the EJECT button on the front panel or the remote control is pushed. If there is no disc inside the unit, a disc placed in the slot will be taken inside automatically with LOADING showing on the Digital Display. When the unit ejects a disc and the disc isn't removed after 1 minute, the unit will automatically reload the disc.

PLAY/PAUSE/STEP

When a Playback Control exists, the user needs to push the Play button to start to play the disc.

PAUSE/STEP PAUSE/STEP

## System Setup Using Both Main and Remote Unit



SETUP Press the SETUP button on the unit or remote control when the unit is in the Disc Player mode. The screen will display the System Setting Menu. It is best to navigate using the remote controls cluster buttons.



There are five menus on the System Setting Menu. The General Setup Page will be the first to be displayed on the screen. Using the Cluster buttons navigate the five root menus as:

General Setup (Monitor with wrench image) Audio Setup Page (Speaker image) Video Quality Setup (Movie Reel image) Password Setup Page (Lock image) Exit Setup Menu (X image)

Once the desired root menu is found, press ENTER on remote to confirm the selection of this menu. The ENTER button is the oval in the center of the cluster buttons. The cursor, a light yellow bar, will cover the first sub-menu under the selected root menu.


If there is more than one sub-menu under the root menu, then use the cluster buttons to navigate in the sub-menus.





### TYPICAL WALL PLATE WIRING HOOKUP






